Who We Are

Childhood is a time for innocence and hope. A time for children to be carefree and to be able to dream of bright futures. Every child deserves to grow up in an environment that is safe and free from harm. Sadly, child abuse is a harsh reality facing children here in Lamar and Red River Counties. We are fighting everyday to bring awareness and action to these children whose carefree dreams have been taken away.

The Children's Advocacy Center of Paris (CAC) provides the critical services children and their non-offending families need as they go through the criminal justice system. The CAC coordinates the investigation of the most severe cases of child abuse in our community. The CAC brings the professional agencies that investigate child abuse together to form a team that collaborates and shares information so that the child's best interests are kept in mind. **Our average client is an 11 year old girl who has been sexual abused by someone she knows and trusts.** Since 1999, the CAC of Paris has worked with Law Enforcement, Child Protective Services, Mental and Medical Health Providers and Prosecutors to help over 3,275 victims of abuse.

- 99% of Children seen knew & trusted their Perpetrators


 154 children received MDT Case Reviews

Onsite Mental Health

Our newest program is designed to give child victims and their families free counseling to help them heal from the abuse they have experienced. Our CAC Counselor provides

Trauma Focused-Cognitive Behavioral Therapy to help children deal with what happened and get back to being kids again.

Child victims receiving counseling	45

Without awareness and education, the cycle of child abuse will continue. In 2014, we were proud to be able to train over 1300 school & daycare personnel in How To Recognize and Report Abuse. We went to every school district in Lamar County and presented this free training 13 times. We held 3 "Lunch & Learn" events for community leaders interested in learning more about the CAC and take a tour of our beautiful facility. We also had the privilege of speaking at various civic clubs and businesses.
